Week 1- Halloween/Bonfire Night-Fireworks

We will not be learning about the celebration of Halloween but instead taking part in fun activities and stories such as 10 Little Monsters and Room on the Broom by Julia Donaldson. We will make potions, count spiders, colour mix to make orange and purple etc.

Dance- Ghostbusters dance.

Bonfire night- firework splatter painting, create shape rockets, make edible sparklers etc.

This is just a rough overview. There are ideas of what we can do linking to each mini topic. The tasks aim to cover all areas of the EYFS.

We are flexible in our days and topics and aim to follow children's interests and learning needs.

Literacy and maths may be taught discretely as well as topical. We will follow RWI phonics when appropriate, share as many stories and rhymes as possible in a day, make opportunities for maths and counting and lots of physical play in the school hall and outdoors.

Communication and language and PSE will be an integral part of the day whether it's through our learning environment, carpet time, group time or one to one.



Week 2- Rhyming stories/ Remembrance day

Lots of rhyming stories...teaching children to hear and say the rhyming words.

Counting syllables in words.

Painting and making poppies.

Week 3- World Nursery Rhyme Week

Learning known and unknown rhymes off by heart. Sequencing rhymes in the correct order. Lots of crafts linked to the rhymes.

Dance- Nursery rhyme dances.

Week 4 and 5- Winter

Learning about the season of winter- changes in temperature, trees, hibernation, winter clothes etc... Sharing lots of fact and fiction winter books including Stickman.

Dance- Do you want to build a snowman? Frozen theme.

'Here comes the snow' by Theresa Jennings.

Week 6, 7 and 8- Christmas

Lots of Christmas crafts- making tree decorations, calendars and cards.

Learning new songs and games. Sharing Christmas stories. Creating Christmas repeating patterns. Writing Christmas lists. Enjoy our Christmas party!
