Sports Premium Allocation (SP19) September 2019 to August 2020

The government is continuing to provide additional funding for the academic year 2019 to 2020 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Funding for 2019/20 is a £16000 lump sum with an additional £10 per child in years 1-6, based upon the January 2019 school census. Schools have flexibility on how they use the funding but it should be used to increase and improve physical education available to pupils.

Development and training of staff to provide sustainable improvements is also a key focus.

At Newlathes Nursery & Infant School funding of £17,220 will be received this year.

Priorities for SP19

- To ensure that the funding is spent on sustainable initiatives.
- Increase participation in sports activities.
- Improve sporting facilities in school.
- Whole school staff training.
- Subsidise after school sports clubs.

How these priorities will be achieved

- £3100 towards provision of new PE and sports equipment
- £2000 subsidy for after school sports clubs
- £600 equipment for lunchtime sports activities.
- £8500 to work with sports coaches to improve teachers' skills
- £3000 to purchase Moki bands to use in Y2

Review

- Sports clubs were on offer after school with an excellent participation rate across school. Summer term clubs couldn't go ahead because of school lockdown.
- Working with sports coaches to improve teachers' skills gave teachers ideas for sports activities they could use with their classes and improved teacher confidence.
- New PE and sports equipment helped teachers deliver fun and engaging lessons
- The Moki bands improved physical activity in Y2 classes. Competition developed between the classes (and staff) which led to additional activity.
