## **Sports Premium Allocation (SP20) September 2020 to August 2021**

The government is continuing to provide additional funding for the academic year 2020 to 2021 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. Funding for 2020/21 is a £16000 lump sum with an additional £10 per child in years 1-6, based upon the January 2020 school census. Schools have flexibility on how they use the funding but it should be used to increase and improve physical education available to pupils especially in the light of reduced activity during national lockdown.

At Newlathes Nursery & Infant School funding of £17,200 will be received this year.

### **Priorities for SP20**

- To ensure that the funding is spent on sustainable initiatives.
- Increase participation in sports activities.
- To look after pupils' wellbeing
- Improve our outdoor area to encourage more physical activity

### **How these priorities will be achieved**

- £12000 towards outdoor climbing facilities
- £4000 towards coaches working with staff and children
- £1000 for additional PE equipment
- £200 for replacement Moki bands

### **Review**

- The climbing facility now named 'The Treehouse' has been very successful for the whole school. During the reopening of schools, separate playtimes and playgrounds were required. Each class bubble was allocated specific days to be on the treehouse. This allowed for smaller numbers of children to climb, balance and slide without overcrowding. Children were able to develop their gross motor skills confidently.
- Coaches continued to develop children's and staff sporting knowledge. Sports coaches were in school when restrictions allowed.
- The continued replacement of sporting equipment to ensure all children have access to the correct equipment.
- Batteries were replaced in all Moki bands.- This replacement will be a continued cost.
