The government is continuing to provide additional funding for the academic year 2021 to 2022 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. Funding for 2021/22 is a £16000 lump sum with an additional £10 per child in years 1-6, based upon the January 2021 school census. Schools have flexibility on how they use the funding but it should be used to increase and improve physical education available to pupils especially in the light of reduced activity during national lockdown. At Newlaithes Nursery & Infant School funding of £17,200 will be received this year.

Key priorities

- Provide opportunities in school for all children, including disadvantaged, to engage in a variety of sports and physical activity both at playtimes and in timetabled PE lessons.
- Developing the teaching of PE across the school through CPD and observing trained sports coaches.
- Replacing and improving the resources used in school to teach PE.
- Providing children with an introduction to local sports during sports week, in order to inspire them to be active outside of school.

All excess spent above the allocated sports premium funding has been taken from elsewhere in the school budget.

Review

- PE lessons are now more well resourced and teachers have access to a wide range of equipment.

- Children are now more active at playtimes and have access to a range of different sports and activities, including dance, football, basketball, netball and various physical activities that develop gross motor skills.
- The use of sports coaches has allowed teachers to observe high-quality PE lessons as part of their own CPD, along with having the opportunity to better assess children in their class with regards to their achievements in PE.
- Children had the opportunity to engage with two local sports clubs during sports week, alongside other activities in school.
