For the academic year of 2022/23, Newlathes Nursery and Infant School were awarded a sum of £17,200. A breakdown of how this sum is allocated and how we are expected to spend and report it can be found [here](#).

This year a key focus for the spending of our sports premium has been developing our teaching staff's ability to deliver outstanding PE lessons and improving levels of physical activity in school at breaktimes, lunchtimes and during after school clubs.

We redesigned our use of sports coaches to bring in experts in the main fields of the KS1 national curriculum and good EYFS practice. Teachers observed these lessons and in some cases were involved in team-teaching parts of sessions to develop their own practice and get feedback from other professionals. Mr Harker, our PE lead, has also attended a number of courses that have allowed us to reassess our curriculum and pedagogy moving forwards and make the changes that will even further improve our delivery of PE. As a result our staff are now more confident and able to deliver outstanding PE.

For the coming academic year, we have invested in RealPE, a new scheme of work that will be used in the 2023/24 year. We chose this scheme due to the fundamentals-based approach that it has to PE and the opportunities for staff development through online CPD and in-house CPD as an optional add-on next year.

We recognise the importance of allowing children to be active outside of PE lessons so have invested in additional sports equipment that can be used at playtimes by all children. This negates the financial barrier for those children from disadvantaged backgrounds, by not requiring them to bring their own footballs, basketballs etc. into school to use and provides everyone with the free option of engaging with sports in their free time. This is something we began to consider last year and have continued to build upon this year.
